

Day 1: New Ulaanbaator International Airport [UBN], Mongolia

Meet and greet at the airport and transfer to the hotel or camp

Mongolia

Mongolia is a fascinating ancient country famous for the Steppe, Genghis Khan, and spectacular natural scenery. Remote wilderness areas also feature an intriguing cultural history. Today over a million nomads continue to live the life of traditional herdsmen. Mongolia is still developing as a nation and, as a result, the infrastructure and amenities are basic outside the capital city of Ulaanbaatar. While visitors to the capital will find a range of luxury hotels, restaurants and facilities catering to all the needs of the modern traveller, the country's primary drawcard is undoubtedly the exquisite stretches of remote countryside where outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy a range of exhilarating adventures, such as horseriding across the Gobi desert, hiking, mountain biking or even a homestay in a traditional yurt.







Day 2: Ugii Lake, Mongolia

Breakfast at camp and transfer to Ugii Lake

Lunch enroute local restaurant

Check in Ugii Lake camp and admire the beauty of the Lake

Grab the sunset opportunity at the camp

Dinner and overnight at camp (shared toilet and shower)







Day 3: Orkhon Valley, Mongolia

Enjoy the sunrise at the lake and have your breakfast at the camp

Drive to Kharkhorin Erdene Zuu, get a view of Orkhon Valley which is the UNESCO site

Visit the Erdene Zuu Musuem and have lunch at local restaurant

Transfer to the Elsen Tsasarkhai sand dune and check in the camp

Day 4: Hustai National Park, Mongolia

Breakfast at camp

Transfer to Hustai National Park

Lunch en route local restaurant

Briefing about the wildlife in the National Park and start the walk into the mountain

Dinner and overnight at camp (shared toilet and shower)

Hustai National Park

Located a 2-3 hour drive westward from Ulaanbaatar, Hustai National Park sprawls across a vast expanse of arid steppe, expansive forests, and gentle slopes. Amid this pristine wilderness thrives Mongolia's last surviving herd of Przewalski's Horse, once extinct in the wild until their successful reintroduction to this very preserve. Accessible via a sealed road, adventurers can explore the untamed terrain, encountering not only these majestic wild horses but also glimpses of other native wildlife, including regal falcons and eagles soaring above. Visitors have the opportunity to witness Takhi, Red Deer (elk), marmots (in summer), gazelles, birds of prey, and other wildlife throughout the seasons, alongside deer stones, burial sites, and stone carvings dating back from the bronze age to the 7th-century Turkic period.







Day 5: Ulaanbaator, Mongolia

Breakfast at camp. Transfer to the Captial - Ulaanbaatar

Enjoy a Korean lunch, visit the Sukhabbtar Square and city tour of the captial

Traditional concert about the Mongolian culture

Dinner at local hot pot restuarant

Ulaanbaatar

Also known as Ulan Bator, the Mongolian capital of Ulaanbaatar is known for intense commerce, hectic traffic, boisterous nightlife and a fascinating bohemian counter-culture. This chaotic capital starkly contrasts the vast expanses of exquisite wilderness for which Mongolia is known. While Ulaanbaatar is typically used as merely a gateway for travellers keen to explore the magnificent surrounding countryside, the city itself has some intriguing points of interest. Watch traditional theatre, try out some delicious international cuisine, visit numerous monasteries and museums or party till the sun comes up! Don't miss Sukhbaatar Square, the city's main square featuring statues of the national heroes of Chinggis Khan and Sukhbaatar.







Premium Hotel Ulaanbaatar

Premium Hotel Ulaanbaatar is located in the heart of Ulaanbaatar. The rooms at the hotel come equipped with TVs, writing desks, telephones, tea and coffee making facilities, and mini-bars. The hotel features a Chinese restaurant, French restaurant, coffee shop, fitness centre, and a beauty salon. Popular area attractions include the Mongolian National Modern Art Gallery, Choijin Lama Temple Museum, and the National Amusement Park.







Day 6: Ulaanbaator, Mongolia

Transfer to the Chinggis Khaan statue and visit the biggest cashmere outlet

Lunch at local restaurant

Dinner and overnight at Enjoy Inn Camp (shared toilet and shower)

Chinggis Khaan National Museum

The Chinggis Khaan National Museum is a must-see attraction for anyone interested in the history and culture of Mongolia. Located in the capital city of Ulan Bator, the museum showcases the legacy of the legendary ruler Genghis Khan and his successors. The museum has six floors of exhibition halls, conference halls, special exhibition halls, honor houses and libraries. The museum is divided into three main sections: the ancient kingdoms before Genghis Khan, the period of the Mongol Empire, and the period of the Great Khan dynasty. Visitors can admire more than 90% of original exhibits, ranging from weapons and armor to paintings and manuscripts. The museum also uses advanced technology such as AR and VR to create immersive and interactive experiences for the guests.

Breakfast at camp

Sightseeing at the Tuv province

Enjoy the horse riding with your guide crossing the river

Stone barbeque dinner at the camp

Overnight at Enjoy Inn Camp (shared toilet and shower)
